AWARDS

In each championship halter class a champion banner and a larger three tail reserve champion rosette will be awarded. All other 4-H classes will receive 1st, 2nd and 3rd place plaques. 4th through 10th place will receive rosettes. The Champion 4-H Color Guard receives a championship banner. Color guard team members and alternates 1st-3rd receive individual plaques, 4th-10th receive ribbons based on the team's placing.

ARRIVAL AND RELEASE PROCEDURE

1. You may arrive the day of or the night prior to your class. Allow enough time for congested traffic and for confirming entries.
2. All 4-H'ers' trucks and trailers must first report to the 46th Street lot just north of the State Fairgrounds for number assignments. Trucks will be released to State Fair Gate 3 for unloading. A limited number of trucks will be released for unloading as space becomes available on the State Fairgrounds.
3. Once inside Gate 3, follow directions for unloading. It is recommended that 4-H'ers' bring a wheelbarrow for unloading and cleaning their stall.
4. **Upon arrival, check-in at the Horse and Pony stalling table. The 4-H member will receive a stalling assignment and a packet that contains their show number and a State Fair pin. (All yellow enrollment forms must be presented at check-in)**
5. Stall horse and move in supplies. Each 4-H horse and pony animal will be assigned a stall by the State Fair Board personnel under the department director's supervision. Each 4-H'er will be assigned 1/4 of a tack stall. Locks are not permitted on the stall doors. All horses must be bedded with a minimum of 1 bale of shavings. The horse may not be put in any stall except the stall assigned.
6. Do not bring TV's, microwaves, tables, etc. due to State Fire Marshal guidelines. **Items causing a fire hazard (e.g. blocking aisles) will be confiscated.**
7.

All exhibitors entering the Fairgrounds on or after Friday, August 6, must pay admission or an exhibitor ticket is required. Any exhibitor leaving the Fairgrounds, wishing to return the same day must obtain a hand stamp from the gate attendant or pay admission to re-enter. This policy will be strictly enforced. Pass outs are not permitted after 8:00 pm.

Additional exhibitor tickets may be purchased in person at the Entry Department Office, Communications Building, Indiana State Fairgrounds.

8. After unloading all trucks and trailers, 4-H'ers must seek parking outside the Fairgrounds proper. This year you will have two options:
 - a. Parking will be available for trucks and trailers at the 46th Street truck lot at no charge.
 - b. Parking will be available for trucks and trailers in the South 38th Street Lot, just south of the State Fairgrounds across 38th Street. Reserved lot costs \$5 per vehicle per day (truck and trailer combination \$10 per day). Reserved parking will be sold at the South 38th Street Lot during the 4-H Horse Show.
 - c. Once your rig is parked for unloading, you will have 20 minutes to unload your horse and tack. At the end of this time, the vehicle will be towed.
9. Transportation will be provided for exhibitors from the 46th Street lot to Gate 3 of the State Fairgrounds and from Gate 3 back to the 46th Street lot.
10. 4-H animals and exhibitors will be released from the 4-H Horse Stall Office to go get their trailer after they have completed their classes. Bring your "rig" to the same loading and unloading area.
11. When you have cleaned your stall and the barn crew has verified that it is all right, you will be given a Gate 3 RELEASE PASS, which must be turned into the gate attendant before you will be allowed to leave the Fairgrounds. Failure to follow this exit procedure may result in loss of eligibility for the 2011 Indiana State Fair and/or administrative penalty.

4-H HORSE AND PONY STATE FAIR

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

All 4-H exhibitors who participate in the State Fair 4-H Horse and Pony Show and their parents/guardians shall jointly sign a hold harmless release waiver as a part of the state 4-H Horse and Pony entry form that releases and discharges the Indiana State Fair, the Indiana 4-H program, and their component members and successors from liability by reason of injury to persons and/or property, including death.

1. Note: All 4-H Horse/Pony classes shall be judged by the current edition of the Indiana 4-H Horse and Pony Handbook (4-H 661). Therefore, exhibitors should secure a personal copy from their local county Extension office. Refer to 4-H 661 for any policies/terms not addressed in this Handbook/Premium List.
2. All ENTRIES must be made in accordance with the official Indiana State Fair 4-H entry form which is available at the County Extension Office, or online at www.indianastatefair.com, by July 1.
3. Each 4-H horse and pony member wishing to exhibit at the Indiana State Fair must fill out and return to the respective County Extension Office an official Indiana 4-H Horse and Pony enrollment form (4-H 516) prior to May 15. **4-H members in good standing and in 3rd-12th grade are eligible to show their enrolled horse at the State Fair. Grade determined by grade in school as of January 1, of the current year.**
4. Each county may make multiple color guard entries for the State Fair in the county's name by using a color guard entry form. The entry may contain six (6) participants plus two (2) alternates. Each of the eight (8) animals must have been enrolled by the 4-H'er prior to the May 15 deadline. Color guard exhibitors may enter three (3) classes in addition to one color guard class.
5. Color guard exhibitors must complete individual entry forms, in addition to the team form submitted by the County/Coach.
6. 4-H horse and pony exhibitors may enter only one horse and show in a total of 3 classes in only one of the three shows (English Show, Western Show or Contesting).
7. Each 4-H horse and pony may be entered and shown at the State Fair by only one (1) 4-H member (excluding mare and foal - considered as one animal.)
8. It is recommended that the same combination of animal and rider entered for the State Fair show have shown in the same class, if offered, or most similar class if same class is not offered in either their county or area show.
9. Animals must be in the 4-H member's ownership/approved lease and records started prior to May 15. This ownership/approved lease shall be continuous until after the State Fair.
10. 4-H animals purchased, sold or offered for sale after the enrollment deadline and prior to the Indiana State Fair (**including animals that have gone through a "Premium Only Auction"**), shall not be eligible to show in the 4-H show at the Indiana State Fair.
11. Prior to July 1, please go to www.indianastatefair.com and enter online. Select State Fair, Animals/Livestock (Online Entry) tab or Competitions/Contests on the lower right. If you choose to enter via mail each 4-H'er must postmark (**no metered mail**) the entry form and send with a \$15 entry fee to the Entry Department, Indiana State Fair, 1202 E. 38th St., Indianapolis, IN 46205-2869 by July 1. An additional \$50 fee for each exhibitor, per department (project), must accompany each entry postmarked from July 2nd-July 31st. Entries or class changes after July 31st must be **hand delivered** to the Entry Department in the Communications building no later than **5:00 pm** on the **day before** you show. New entries must be accompanied by a \$15.00 entry fee plus an **additional** \$50 late fee plus an **additional** \$50 per animal fee. Make check or money order payable to the Indiana State Fair, or complete credit card information and signature. No cash accepted. It is suggested that you secure a certificate of Mailing from the clerk at the Post Office window.

WARNING! If all information is not completed on the entry form (one exhibitor per form) and payment or valid credit card information enclosed, the entry will be returned to the 4-H'er and will be subject to all applicable late fees or result in disqualification.

The Indiana State Fair Board is requiring all Indiana Exhibitors to provide the Indiana State Board of Animal Health required Premises ID number on all entry forms for beef and dairy cattle, goats, swine and sheep. Indiana exhibitors of horses, poultry, llamas and alpacas as well as out of state exhibitors will be requested to voluntarily provide Premises ID numbers.

12. Confirmation of entries will be mailed to the 4-H exhibitor if there is sufficient return mail time. Exhibitors should bring confirmation of their entries with them at time of check-in. **Confirmation of entries cannot be made over the phone.**
13. 4-H members must show their own animals. In cases where this cannot be done, the owner may have their animals shown by another 4-H Horse and Pony exhibitor (in conformation classes only). Substitute showmen must be approved in writing by the 4-H show manager 24 hours prior to the showing of the animal(s) needing a substitute showman. Requests will only be granted for medical emergencies, conflicts with showing other animals, or circumstances deemed unavoidable by the 4-H show manager. Failure to be excused from a job and/or participation in a sporting event or sports practice will not result in a substitute showman being granted.
14. Any Horse/Pony exhibited must be shown and owned by the child, or owned in partnership with the child's father, mother, brother, sister, aunt, uncle, grandparent or legal guardian. Note exception: leased Horses/Ponies may be shown if they follow county policy regarding leases, in the county from which the entry is submitted.
15. The decision of the judges will be final. Questions concerning terms and conditions are to be presented to the 4-H show manager for consideration.
16. The State Fair show committee reserves the right to measure and verify the I.D. of any horse or pony entered in the State Fair Horse & Pony Show. Only one (1) measurement will then be made, and that measurement will supersede previous measurements.
17. The State Fair management reserves the right to drug test any animal at any time. See drug policy, fraud and deception section in the front of the State Fair 4-H/FFA book. Refusing the tests will cause disqualification. Exhibitors of horses and ponies selected for drug testing will be required to fill out and sign a "4-H Horse and Pony Affidavit". A sample of this form appears later in this section and is also available at your County Extension Office or the Indiana State Fair Entry Department. Check with your veterinarian if you are using any over the counter medications to ensure they will not violate the State Fair drug policy. Do **not** send the affidavit with your entry form. The affidavit must be completed at the State Fair show.
18. Exhibitors are responsible for checking in at the make-up ring just prior to their class and safely entering the arena or they may be disqualified. Splits for performance classes will be posted at the Show Office.
19. Contesting horses will be brought to the arena in a controlled manner as determined by the judge before beginning the pattern. Assistance may be given by one (1) person of contestants' choice (**not show personnel**). Any changes in this procedure will be announced before the class. Failure to enter or leave the arena in a controlled manner will result in disqualification, at the discretion of the judge. Running or galloping into the arena is an automatic disqualification, at the discretion of the judge.
20. Only 4-H horse and pony members may ride, lunge or drive 4-H animals on the show grounds.
21. Animals are not to be ridden on the Fairgrounds except in the Pepsi Coliseum or Toyota Outdoor Arena at scheduled times. Failure to comply will result in loss of awards and dismissal from the show grounds.
22. 4-H'ers entered in over-fences classes may walk the course without their horse or pony for five (5) minutes prior to the over-fences classes. Hunter hack entries will not walk the course.
23. Official show stewards will be hired and charged with the authority to enforce 4-H terms and conditions. His/her decision may only be appealed to the grievance committee.
24. Mare and foal winners are not eligible for the champion and reserve champion. Mare and foal counts as one class for the exhibitor. Any combination of 2 additional classes is allowed.
25. Mules, donkeys, horses and ponies (including miniature horses & draft horses) are eligible to show at the State Fair 4-H horse and pony show and must comply to these terms and conditions.
26. Dogs are **not** permitted in the horse barn and surrounding area.
27. A negative Coggins test is not required, but is recommended.
28. Read health terms and conditions, general terms and conditions and ownership terms and conditions located in the front of the State Fair 4-H/FFA book. Especially note terms and conditions on behavior, tampering, misrepresentation, drugs, etc.
29. Fans must have proper safety approved shrouds.
30. No animals will be allowed to check in early or stay beyond posted times.
31. Certified headgear and a boot with a heel shall be worn in all mounted classes, as well as when 4-H members are mounted on the State Fairgrounds for any reason. It is the responsibility of the 4-H member to ensure that the headgear meets the requirements outlined in 4-H 661.
32. No pedestrians will be allowed on the Pepsi Coliseum and Toyota Outdoor Arena floor during horse and pony warm-up or practice times.
33. **Only shavings are allowed for bedding stalls. All stalls with horses must have at least one (1) bag of shavings. Exhibitors are not allowed to sleep in stalls with animals. This is dangerous!**
34. By order of the State Fire Marshal, aisles and exits must remain clear at all times. Failure to comply may result in disqualification, removal of awards, and suspension of the privilege of exhibiting at the State Fair.

35. Classes offered in the State Fair 4-H Horse and Pony Show are subject to evaluation, and may be eliminated or combined due to low participation.
36. Exhibitors of American Quarter Horses who include the registration number of their horse on their entry form will have any placing they receive forwarded to the AQHA for inclusion in the horse's official performance record.
